Recycling and Farm-To-Table

In the 21st Century, two terms we hear a lot are "recycling" and "farm-to-table." Consider these two terms were also relevant to people during the 1700's and 1800's when the Annearrundell County Free School was established.

At the Free School Museum we have a collection of lunch pails some of which were originally molasses tins or tobacco tins. Not all our students could afford shiny new lunch pails. They had to recycle and use tins and containers that were originally for another purpose.

In the lunch pail students might find some homemade bread with lard or a cold potato and maybe an apple, never an orange. Why never an orange? Not only were there few trade routes to the south where oranges grow, but travel was slow, and there was not climate controlled storage. Students had to eat what was grown locally on their farms or nearby farms.

So while today we are choosing to employ the sustainable strategies of recycling and farm-to-table, schoolmasters, school marms, and students at the Annearrundell County Free School had no choice. It was how they lived!

The University of Maryland

1. Conducting research to better understand falls and prevent falls

- Participants must be at least 65 and in good heath.

Johns Hopkins

1. Conducting research on Knee Osteoarthritis

- Participants must be at least 45 years of age and have osteoarthritis in their knee
- The study involves 5 visits to the Bayview Hospital where sensory testing and blood is drawn.
- All examinations, parking, and test are provided at no cost.
- Transportation to all study visits provided free of cost.
- Compensation is up to \$1475.00.

2. Investigating the effectiveness of a drug designed to slow memory loss

- To be eligible, you must have mild memory changes and be between 55 and 85 years old
- The research involves up to 10 visits over 18 months; tests of memory, thinking and behavior; PET and MRI scans of the brain; and taking either the investigative drug or a placebo.
- · Compensation is up to \$700.00

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

During this past legislative session, our Legislative Committee, in conjunction with MRSPA's Legislative Committee, had been busy tracking legislation that could impact your finances or health care in retirement. We also organized and held our Legislative Luncheon on February 19th in the Anne Arundel Delegation Room in the House of Representatives. 11 of our AARSPA members joined more than 35 of our Legislators and/or their Aides and discussed important legislative issues such as the security of our pension funding and the impact of the Kirwan funding on our local school district and in turn on our health benefits.

We are happy to report our current pension system has remained unchanged during this year's session. The Coronavirus State of Emergency as declared by Governor Larry Hogan, will have no effect on the payment of monthly pension benefits. The payment of benefits and the processing of new retirement applications will proceed without interruption.
