

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CONSUMER UPDATE

Over-the-Counter Drugs

If you have high blood pressure, consult your doctor before using any over-the-counter (OTC) cold products. These can be dangerous for people with diabetes, glaucoma or enlarged prostate. These products usually contain decongestants such as pseudoephedrine and phenylephrine that help clear a stuffy nose by narrowing blood vessels. However, they also can raise blood pressure and heart rate and alter blood sugar levels. Consult your doctor or pharmacist before taking any of these medicines.

Stop and smell the roses! New findings found that of the 756 subjects studied, those who took a moment to consider the good things in life throughout the day (such as a beautiful sunrise) had better health compared to those who did not notice such things.

Your Pet

If you live alone, it is important that you take steps to ensure your pet is taken care of if vou are in an accident. Choose a caregiver someone your dog or cat is familiar with and who knows how to care for your pet. Keep the information in your wallet so that you can give it to emergency personnel. Be sure the caregiver has access to your house, necessary information of your pet's schedule and vet's number. You can sign an agreement with your vet that will allow him/ her to treat your pet if needed. It is also a good idea to put a rescue alert label in your window - this tells firefighters and other emergency personnel that there is a pet in the house.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD PROPOSED DUES CHANGE



At the last Executive Board meeting, there was a discussion about the need to raise AARSPA dues. The Executive Board voted to present to the membership an increase in dues of \$5.00, from \$10.00 per year to \$15.00 beginning next fiscal year. As the bylaws state, a final vote on a dues increase must take place at the May 9, 2013 general meeting at Renditions. Research in the *History of the Anne Arundel Retired Teachers Association Inc. 2000-2005* indicates that the last time Association dues were raised was in July 2003 when they went from \$5.00 to \$10.00.

For the past several years, putting together a workable budget has become increasingly difficult. Committee chairs have had to work with fewer and fewer funds in their budgets. Historically, AARSPA has provided three scholarships as part of the Scholarship for Scholars program to deserving high school graduates. However, because of budget constraints we have only been able to offer two scholarships the past two years. It is only because of some very generous donations from outside organizations and members that we have been able to pay for three, but there is no guarantee. We have been looking at saving some money by sending out our newsletter, the *Informer*, electronically, but thus far we have only 600 email addresses of members who would like to receive this communication electronically. With this small number it is about a wash as far as saving money. We would need at least 1,000 of our 1900+ members to take the newsletter electronically to realize any real savings.

I bring this to your attention now so that you have a "heads up" before the first meeting in September. I ask that you give this some consideration and ask that you share your thoughts and suggestions with members of the Executive Board. 


