Potomac Eagle Scenic Train Ride, The Trough, Eagles & Lunch in Romney, West Virginia Wednesday, October 12, 2022

Your Help Is Needed

On June 8, 1968, the train carrying the body of Robert F. Kennedy passed through Maryland on its way from New York to Washington, DC. Along the whole route, people lined the tracks to show their respect or simply to watch as it passed by.

In 2018, the book *Robert F. Kennedy Funeral Train – The People's View*, written by Rein Jelle Terpstra, was published. This book contained numerous pictures capturing the thousands of people along the route. This picture of a family, taken in the vicinity of Old Dorsey Road, close to where the 84 Lumber is now located, is one of those pictures included in the book. It was taken by Paul Fusco.

Mr. Terpstra, who lives in Amsterdam, is trying to interview the many people photographed in the book to get their thoughts and memories. Working with Margie Masino, a recent graduate of the University of Delaware, he is assembling the memories and varied thoughts of these people, many of which were children back in 1968.

With your help, they would like to hopefully connect with someone from this family. Maybe you taught the children or know the parents or know someone who might know them. Did You Know?

Around 1907 the original Annearrundell County Free School building were sold to help raise funds to build new schools elsewhere. In March of 1911 the Legislature sold the original property to Luther L. and Fannie McKenney. In May of 1915 the building was deed to Benjamin F. and Bertha P. Van Horne. In September 1940 it was deeded to Myer Lynsky and conveyed to Morris Lynsky in October 1956. In September 1958 the property was conveyed to the Green Hill Company and then conveyed to Lavall, Inc. in January 1974. The building and property then became the property of Anne Arundel County Public Schools.


