FREE SCHOOL NEWS

Celebrate Maryland Day Weekend at the Annearrundell County Free School Museum



While Maryland Day is Wednesday, March 25, 2020, the founding of our state will be celebrated all throughout the previous weekend, March 20-22, 2020. With support from the Four Rivers Heritage Area, a variety of activities and events will take place at many historic sites and museums in Anne Arundel County. The Annearrundell County Free School Museum will participate in this county-wide celebration on Sunday, March 22, 2020 from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m.

A schoolmaster and a school marm will welcome guests to this one-room school house, most likely the only surviving structure as the result of the Maryland Free School Act of 1723. Guests will learn about the history of education in Maryland and see examples of learning tools used in the 1700's and 1800's. Guests will see several artifacts on display from a 1979 archeological dig as well as a variety of toys from the colonial era.

If you are not able to attend this event, remember the Free School Museum is open on the second Saturday and second Sunday of April, May, June, July and August. Tours for school-aged children and adults can also be arranged by appointment. Contact Karlie Everett (410-268-8656 or karlieeverett@verizon.net). Maryland Free Schools 1723

In 1723 the Colonial Assembly established "Free Schools" in the then twelve existing counties. According to the "Maryland County Formation Years," in 1707 the twelve existing counties were Baltimore, Anne Arundel, Prince George's, Calvert, Charles, St. Mary's, Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's, Talbot, Dorchester, and Somerset. The next listing for Maryland County Formation is documented as occurring in 1727. The change recorded at that time was that Anne Arundel gained from Baltimore.

A "History of Education in Maryland" was written by Bernard Christian Steiner in 1894. On page 42 of this book, Steiner begins writing about what happened to the schools established during this early period. He writes:

St. Mary's, Charles, and Prince George's became Charlotte Hall in 1774

Calvert merged into Lower Marlborough Academy in 1778

Kent became Washington College in 1782

Talbot merged into Washington College in 1782

Cecil was given to trustees of the poor in 1787

Dorchester was given to trustees of the poor in 1788

Somerset and Worcester merged into the Eden School 1770

Anne Arundel continued under the Act of 1723 and 1795

Baltimore [Co.] continued in 1822 but diverted to poor children.

While Steiner includes Worcester which is not listed as a county in 1707 or 1727, he omits Queen Anne's which is listed as a county in 1707. The "Maryland Historical Magazine" mentions the First Free School in Queen Anne's County as being on one hundred acres situated on the south side of the main road that leads from Queenstown to Chester Mills.

Maryland Senior Citizens Hall of Fame 2019 Inductees



Mildred "Millie" Gardner contacted the Anne Arundel County Police Department to offer her services after her retirement from the Anne Arundel County Public Schools. Millie was first assigned to the Public Information Office to assist with answering telephone calls and administrative duties and later, to the Northern District Station, to answer and direct citizens' calls to the appropriate departments and to assist the District secretary with filing and organizing paper work.

Millie's desire to stay connected to her profession led her to become a member of the Anne Arundel Retired School Personnel Association, chairing the Remembrance Committee.

Her commitment to education is evident through her active participation in Alpha Delta Kappa, an international association of outstanding educators. She is past president and continues to represent the Maryland chapter at conferences and conventions

She serves as a greeter at her church, Faith Baptist, where she also teaches the younger children in religion classes.



Deborah Ahalt learned from her mother what serving others means. Following her example, she became involved with SERV International, tagging and organizing Fair Trade handicraft items for shipment and sale. The profits from this activity aids artisans and farmers from disadvantaged communities around the world.

After retiring from Anne Arundel County Public Schools, Deborah became a member of AARSPA. Here she used her skills to create a Facebook page to advertise the organization. She is also a member of the Community Service Committee, helping to collect and deliver supplies to the animal control center as well as school supplies and clothing items to schools with a high population of disadvantaged students.

One of Deborah's biggest joys is her work with puppies to be trained as service companions for veterans. She cleans their cages, but she especially enjoys helping the puppies socialize through play.



Virginia Crespo joined AARSPA after 32 years of teaching Government in Anne Arundel County Public Schools. She provided knowledge, information and resources for issues such as retirement benefits, pharmacy and health, pension accounts and other legislative issues pending before the Maryland General Assembly.

Virginia also serves as Legislative Committee Chair for the Maryland Retired School Personnel Society. She volunteers with the United Seniors of Maryland (USM) and is a member of the United States Lighthouse Society (Chesapeake Chapter) serving as a tour guide. She also works with the preservation crew at Thomas Point Lighthouse. The Census is Coming

What you need to know:

- Check your mail beginning March 2020 for your invitation to complete the Census online.
- All households will have the option of responding online, by mail, or by phone.
- You should be counted at your usual residence (where you sleep most of the time).

The 2020 Census is easy. The questions are simple.

- How many people are living or staying at your home on April 1, 2020.
- Whether the home is owned or rented.
- About the age of each person in your home.
- About the sex of each person in your home.
- About whether a person in your home is of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin.
- About the relationship of each person in your home.

During the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau will never ask you for:

- Your Social Security number
- Money or donations
- Anything on behalf of a political party
- Your bank or credit card account
