NEWS YOU CAN USE

When you or a loved one is being rushed to the hospital is not the time to collect the vital information doctors will need, therefore the Consumer Education Committee of MRSPA has developed a form that will provide the information the hospital will request.

Complete the form we have included and place it in a plastic sleeve, then tape the sleeve to the front of your refrigerator where Emergency Response Teams are trained to look for it. You may also want to keep a copy in your wallet and the glove compartment of your car. Consider making additional copies of the form and sharing the form with others, particularly if there is a medical condition important to the doctors. You may want to make a copy for anyone in your family for whom you are the emergency contact.



Anne Arundel County has a special program called the "Vial for Life" program. Their EMTs are trained to look for a medicine vial containing the vital information on the top shelf of the refrigerator. It is suggested you place a note on the front of the refrigerator telling them about the vial. A special blue vial to hold the information form can be gotten free of charge at some county Fire Departments. However, any medicine vial will do and can be obtained free of charge as most pharmacies.

FEBRUARY DONATIONS

If you would like to donate at the February luncheon, you have several options:

- Children's underwear or socks for distribution in elementary school health rooms
- **Toiletries** such as deodorant, soap, shampoo, hand sanitizer, wipes, mouthwash, hand lotions, etc.
- **Pet supplies** such as unopened canned and dry food, toys, puppy pads, metal bowls, cat carriers, litter (clay, not clumping), towels, treats, washcloths, blankets, and Petsmart/Petco gift cards

Our hope is that you will support whichever of these efforts is closest to your heart.
