Autumn is normally the opening of schools, falling leaves, pumpkin pie, apple cider and family and friends. With a smile and a mask, I bring greetings to all Anne Arundel Retired School Personnel Association (AARSPA) members. COVID-19 has created unique times this past summer and fall, and impacted AACPS to virtually open schools the first semester of this year.

AARSPA officers and members continue to work on behalf of our membership to support our vision, mission and bylaws. We were represented at the MRSPA Leadership Conference by five of our members. Carla Duls and Deb Ahalt both did excellent ZOOM presentations for the MRSPA members around the state about communicating with our communities during COVID. Like many associations around the state, AARSPA has recently purchased a ZOOM site license. The executive board will be conducted in October by ZOOM.Our membership committee has been busy recruiting new members, and the community service committee has established a partnership between AARSPA, AACPS, and Troop 918 Eagle Candidates to build and install Little Libraries at two county schools. Please support the Killarney House Restaurant Scholarship Fundraiser and the Alzheimer's Walk.

In November, we will have our first luncheon at Renditions. To stay safe at the luncheon, AARSPA will

conduct forehead temperature checks upon arrival; masks will be required, except when eating; and social distancing will be maintained. The luncheon will have a maximum attendance of 70 persons; however, there will not be a minimum number of attendees. The facility will be following all Stage 2 or Stage 3 guidelines at this time for COVID-19. The reservation form is in this issue: however, make your decision to attend based on personal and family safety! Our bylaws require an annual business meeting, and we will also have the annual Memorial Service. and the induction of officers. A guest speaker is also tentatively scheduled for this luncheon. We will be collecting new or gently used children's books or donations to support the Little Libraries.

Although I am finishing my second term for the Association, it's critical that AARSPA has somebody nominated/inducted to be the President-Elect or Co-Presidents Elect for 2020-21 and President(s) in 2021. I will be glad to mentor the new nominee(s) with the duties of the President in 2021.

Mia Harper in the AACPS Office of Retirement (410-222-5224) asked me to include an update about Open Enrollment in this AARSPA Informer. The AACPS Retiree Open Enrollment Guides will be mailed to retirees during the last week of September. Open Enrollment will be from October 5 to October 16 for changes to take place January 1, 2021. If you do not wish to make any

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changes, then your current benefits will remain the same for 2021. For most retirees. there will be no increase in monthly premiums. Only those who are funded at the 25% level of healthcare, and who are on Medicare, will see a slight increase in their monthly premium. Those who are enrolled in the HMO or Triple Option and those who pay for Select Vision will receive new cards due to an expansion of the vision coverage next year. Those enrolled in SilverScript prescription will not receive new prescription cards.

The fiscal year (FY21) budget was approved by the general membership by your email or mail majority vote. This is usually approved at our May luncheon; however, it was cancelled this year due to COVID-19.

We have not lost sight of our primary mission to make sure our AACPS retiree health care is not jeopardized, and to work with MRSPA to protect our defined retirement pension. In this ever-changing world, it is my hope that each of you will take an active role

#### FROM THE FREE SCHOOL

For the safety and comfort of our guests, the Free School Museum is closed until further notice.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

By the 1820s, there was a surge of interest in education in America with the view of having an educated electorate. However, the focus of education was on the primary years. This probably happened for two reasons. The first reason was the difficulty in finding a schoolmaster with the skills to teach a variety of upper level content. The second reason was the older students were needed at home to assist with the farming.

Around 1820 the original building and the Keeping Room/summer kitchen were joined together increasing the size of the building. By 1820, the Annearrundell County Free School had 62 students. The teacher was Henry Roe June, who had 13 children of his own. The building was enlarged and the family lived upstairs in the loft. Girls probably began attending the school in the 1820 or 1830s. Prior to this era, girls were expected to stay at home and concentrate on domestic duties such as tending the family garden, cooking, and sewing.

### LITTLE LIBRARIES UPDATE

The AARSPA Community Service Committee has not been totally inactive during this time of Covid-19 restrictions. Thanks to the efforts of Zetta Hart and Rick Wiles, two Little Libraries are ready to be installed; one will be placed on the grounds of Park Elementary School and the other at the Ferndale Early Education Center.

The Little Library boxes were built by students in the carpentry program at CAT-N and completed before the shutdown. Two Life Scouts from Troop 918, who are working toward their Eagle Scout certification, then painted the boxes and did the final site installation, including putting books in the boxes.

While building a couple of boxes may sound like an easy task, there are so many details involved. The design of the boxes must resist rain and be size appropriate to the site. Then there is the matter of permits and site approval as well as actually stocking the boxes with books.

How many books did you and family members read during the lockdown? Now those books can serve as the first installments in our Little Library boxes. New or gently used books suitable for children of all ages as well as adult books will be collected at the November luncheon. We hope you will use this opportunity to share your love of reading with others who do not have access to books. (Monetary donations will also be accepted. If donating by check, make checks out to AARSPA with "Little Libraries" on the subject line.)

## **NEWS YOU CAN USE**

Did you know there are over 1.6 million nonprofits in the United States? Does it seem like everyday you are getting more requests to make a donation to a charity you may or may not have supported in the past? Due the pandemic, the need is even greater. However, what do we really know about these organizations? In fact, what do you know about the charities you already support? Does the organization use your donation in a manner that reflects your values?

There are several websites you can use to determine the worthiness of the nonprofits you support. The largest is *Charity Navigator*. It evaluates and assigns a score to over 5,500 nonprofits that operate within the United States. Because it does not accept any advertisements or money from group it reviews, the ratings are considered the most trustworthy of all the groups that rate charities. Charity Navigator is funded by large organizations such as the *Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF)* and small donations from people like you and me. Because of this funding, there is no charge for their reports.

Charity Navigator rates the nonprofit on several categories and assigns a rating. Those categories include: finance and accountability; impact and results; leadership and adaptability; reputation within the community it serves; and values, diversity and equity within the organization.
