

News You Can Use

Do you recycle? Have you considered how long it takes for products we use everyday to decompose? Scientists estimate the following decomposition rate for products placed in trash instead of recycled.

newspapers - 1 1/2 months tin cans - 50 years plastic cups - 50 years plastic containers - 50-80 years aluminum cans - 200-500 years plastic bottles - 450 years

You may want to reconsider what you place in your trash can. You may have heard of the damage people experienced during covid by flushing personal hygiene wipes. Manufacturers can claim they are "flushable" because they will go through your toilet pipe. However, they do not easily decompose once in the sewer pipes. Over time, this clogs and damages your line. Did you know that facial tissues shouldn't be flushed either? They are manufactured so they won't fall apart when used, so as a result they don't fall apart when they come in contact with water.

What do you do with magazines, newspapers and books when you are finished with them? Consider leaving them in a laundromat for others to enjoy.



Do you love watching birds eating from your bird feeders, the ones you fill daily only to have the squirrels get more of the seeds than the birds? Consider spraying the pole and sides of the feeder with cooking oil. Watching the squirrels slide down may bring the best laugh of the day.




