# **News You Can Use**

Do you ever feel lonely or know someone who has withdrawn over time? Researchers have declared loneliness as a national health emergency affecting every age group. Prolonged loneliness can affect one's health equal to smoking fifteen cigarettes a day. The risk of heart disease can increase as much as 20%, stroke 32%, and an increase of 50% in the risk of dementia.

There are several reasons we can feel lonely. Technology allows us to text a friend instead of actually talking to them. Why leave the house when whatever we need can be delivered to our door? Also, health concerns may make moving about more difficult. Add to this, our family and friends may have moved away or are facing their own challenges. Loneliness is more pronounced in the winter months when leaving the house may be unsafe, and there is less of the much needed sunlight our bodies need.

There are some simple ways to fight loneliness:

- · Check out classes at a Senior Center.
- Take a walk.
- Sit in the sun even if remaining in your house.
- Call a friend; it will benefit both of you.
- Go somewhere.



# From the Desk of the Editor...



With this volume of the *AARSPA Informer*, our Association newsletter is in its 50th year of keeping our members up-to-date on Association activities. The newsletter was originally issued four times a year until Volume 31, 2005-2006, when a December issue was added. When the Florida Get-Together was moved from January to March in 2014, the December issue was moved to January. Today, the newsletter is shared with members in two ways: regular mail and digitally through Constant Contact. In August 2014, I wrote an article for the newsletter, tracking the evolution of the newsletter's names and logos over the years. The content also proved interesting!



The first edition of *AARTA NEWS* was published in August, 1975. The staff at TAAAC typed and reproduced this issue. Mrs Virginia D. Moore was the President of the Association which boasted 179 active members and two honorary members. The State Association, MRTA, had approximately 5,000 members. AARTA and MRTA dues were both \$3.00. AARTA had an office on the second floor of the "new Board of Education building, Riva Road, Annapolis." On July 1, 1975, retired teachers in Maryland received a cost-of-living increase ranging up to 10.9%. Two AARTA members, Ethel N. Andrew and Ruth P Eason, were to be honored at the MRTA Annual Convention in Ocean City in September.



In August of 1979, the newsletter adopted the name The Informer, and the masthead included the "Lamp of Learning' inscribed with "1940", the year of AARTA's inception. Mr. Norwood Wetherhold was AARTA's President, while Lena A. Clemmer was the newsletter editor. Kay Kibler provided the following information about the Free School: "... The Maryland Historical Trust...and the Board of Education are waiting for the Historical Structures Report being done by Joseph Wollon, Architect. When the report has been completed and analyzed, the next step will be to apply for funds for architectural drawings, then funds for structural preservation." The cost for a planned all-day trip to Washington to visit the Air and Space Museum, Woodrow Wilson's Home, and the Textile Museum was \$6.00.



In August 1980, a new logo was added to the masthead which featured aspects of the Maryland flag as well as the inscribed lamp. The August 1981 issue of the *The Informer* was the first that was professionally printed. Luncheon at La Fontaine Bleu in Glen Burnie on September 17, 1981, cost \$7.85.



At the Annual Business meeting in May 2007, the Association's name changed to the "Anne Arundel Retired School Personnel Association" or AARSPA. This change was noted in the title of the August issue of the newsletter: *AARSPA Informer*. The masthead, however, still included the AARTA logo. Betty Ann White, President of the Association, reminded members, "we are the watchdogs of the retirement/pension system." Tickets for the *Holiday Spectacular* at the Meyerhoff in Baltimore were \$36.00. The Free School "is open for visitors on Sunday afternoons, 1-4 p.m. through October 28, 2007". The Yarn Ladies thanked members for their donations of yarn, material, seam binding, and sewing thread.



By December, 2007, AARSPA boasted three different apple-themed logos. The version sporting a red apple was added to the masthead of the *AARSPA Informer.* 

Today, the digital newsletter is available in living color through links on the AARSPA, MRSPA, and AACPS websites.

#### MEMBERSHIP REPORT

This membership meeting is called to order!

MEMBERSHIP in AARSPA and MRSPA is important to US. We know the <u>value</u> of being part of both organizations. We understand the importance of our outreach/community projects, the historical aspects of the Annarrundel Free School, and the collegial atmosphere of our general meeting luncheons. We are very aware of MRSPA's oversight of the state legislature in protecting our present pensions, safeguarding our future needs, and keeping track of future educational impacts. NOW we need to make it important to others.

As your database keeper, I can tell you our numbers are dwindling quickly, and if we do not act, both organizations are in jeopardy of becoming part of the history books. What do we need? NEW MEMBERS – not just the newly retired personnel, but we need to regain those who have not rejoined for various reasons.

This situation is not hopeless, but it does require work. Not just from the executive board but from all of YOU! What can I do, you ask? Let me count the ways:

- TALK it costs nothing. Whenever you have the opportunity to relate with others, spread the word.
- TAKE a membership form (or two) Fold the application form (which includes both the local and state), place it in an envelope, and take it with you (ladies, it will fit in your purse).
- MAIL the application to an out-of-area friend espousing the value and importance of membership, especially for their future.

This spring, MRSPA will not be doing a blind mailing across the state as they are putting a great deal of effort into boosting our visibility to all retired school personnel. They are still offering the reduced membership fee from March 1 through May 31. Applications are available on the MRSPA website.

#### **Dues Deduction**

MRSPA deducts New or Switch and Save member dues any month. Dues deduction files are sent to the Maryland State Retirement Agency (MSRA) on/by the 6<sup>th</sup> of each month. MRSPA receives the deduction report from the state on the 30<sup>th</sup> of each month and 10 days to two weeks later, local treasurers should receive their payment checks. Dues are still deducted only once ANNUALLY, per membership year.

# **Legislative Report**

The Maryland General Assembly is back in session. This year they are faced with a \$3 billion structural deficit. This deficit has been in the making for years but was covered by the extra money coming from the federal government because of the pandemic. That source of income is done. Hard decisions must be made.

Governor Moore has presented his Budget plan. It includes no increase in the sales tax or property taxes. His approach is to overhaul the tax system in Maryland. He proposes changes that will result in tax decreases for many and increases for the wealthiest Marylanders and an decrease in the corporate tax. His package includes broad proposals for bringing more growth to the Maryland economy.

Many difficult and important decisions must be made. The Governor and the leaders of the General Assembly have expressed continued strong support for the Blueprint for Maryland as we strive to make lasting improvements to Maryland schools. Some adaptations and tweaks will be necessary.

This will not be a year for costly new programs, but the MRSPA legislative committee will continue our best efforts to protect our Priorities and our members. Follow our work on the MRSPA web site (mrspa.org).
