News You Can Use

Why do scammers celebrate the new year?

Because as tax season begins, they can plan on thousands of new victims. Don't be one of them!

The IRS will not call you unless you have received a letter in advance notifying you that they may call about a specific concern such as a missing form.

The IRS will never demand immediate payment via debit cards, gift cards, or wire transfers. They will not threaten you with the police or offer to come to your house to pick up money.

They will never request ANY personal information over the phone.

In 2020, the U.S. Department of Justice introduced the National Elder Fraud Hotline to address fraud targeting older citizens. Victims can call the National Elder Fraud Hotline at 833-372-8311(833-FRAUD11).
